New look CEWD hits the road

The Centre for Education and Workforce Development has undergone a refresh following its separation with South Western Sydney Local Health District late last year.

To launch its new look, the centre is hosting a series of roadshows at Sydney Local Health District facilities in the first week of May, starting with Balmain Hospital on April 30.

“The new logo is based on the CEWD education model, and is more representative of the service and its new direction,” said CEWD’s Manager for Innovation, Partnerships and Quality, Lesley Innes.

“The educational model, consisting of seven interdependent domains, makes it easier for staff to find the courses they need to fulfil their professional development and career goals.”

The roadshow consists of two components, the first being a trade display where CEWD will showcase its services. Staff will be on hand to answer questions about its 300 educational offerings, hand out brochures, course information booklets and merchandise. Refreshments will also be available to all comers.

Following the trade display, there will be a formal presentation on the re-launched CEWD, opened by the facility manager. Director Mira Haramis will talk about the centre’s role and new direction, and the Manager of Operations, Rose Meiruntu, will give a demonstration of the new website. The presentation will also include an open forum where attendees can ask questions about the service and provide feedback on their training needs.

“CEWD is a leading provider of education to the NSW Health workforce, and its courses are available to all SLHD staff free of charge, no matter what department, service or hospital they work for,” Ms Haramis said.

“We deliver services in a variety of formats either on location or through online training, clinical simulations as well as partnering with universities to offer post-graduate qualifications. I’m excited about our new initiatives and our future plans for the centre.”

The roadshows will be held at Royal Prince Alfred Hospital on May 1; Canterbury Hospital on May 2; Concord Centre for Mental Health on May 6; Croydon Community Health Centre on May 7; Concord Repatriation General Hospital on May 8, and finally at Sydney Dental Hospital on May 9.
